This year we had two Masters of Ceremonies, Hospital Registrars, Allan Plant and Sam Cutfield. As Allan and Sam seamlessly passed from one to the other, then on to the next finalist, their performance made for a truly well-coordinated and slick event.

Staff were given seven minutes to present their innovation and then asked questions from the floor. Each of the six presentations was excellent. The passion of each of the groups shone through clearly. I was very pleased not to be a judge – they had an extremely difficult job on their hands!

The judges were led by Board Chair Sally Webb, and included Health Consumer Service and Community Representative Anne Burnett, Coordinator of the Practice Development Team Liz Buckley, Clinical Research Development Manager Charlie Stratton, Portfolio Manager Planning and Funding Jackie Davis and Manager Decision Support Trevor Richardson.

The Innovation Awards have been held since 2003. There was strong agreement that the standard this year was excellent, and that the bar has been raised.

There was one thing that was different this year, which came through strongly. Our CARE values were demonstrated in every presentation, with pride. It was wonderful to see how our evolved values are being "owned" by our teams.
